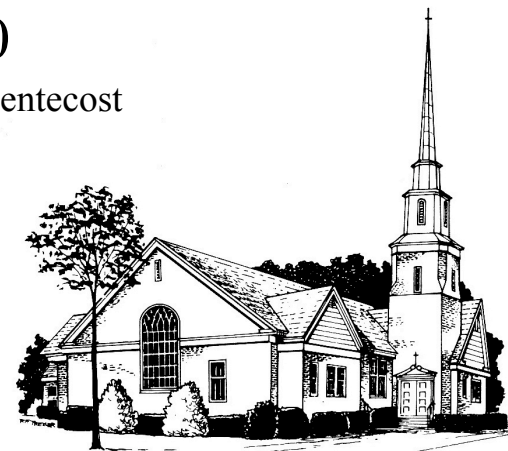

Mission: Atlantic City Rescue Mission provides hope and counsel for those who are caught in the quagmire of homelessness and often addiction. Located in the heart of Atlantic City, the mission has been a lighthouse since 1964. During the pandemic meals are still served and a food pantry is maintained.
